Scene 1

(The playground at the middle school before school. DANDELION enters apprehensively, wearing his backpack and holding his schedule.)

DANDELION. First day of middle school. (Looking up at the building.) This place is gi-normus, even for a lion!

(PIPPA PARROT enters with JENNIFER GIRAFFE and ZIPPY ZEBRA.)

DANDELION (cont'd). Hey, Pippa. Hey, Zippy.

(#1: "All I Wanna Do Is Fit In")

PIPPA. Hey, Dandelion. Have you met Jennifer? She just moved here from Savannah-land.

(All turn to the audience and freeze. Separate lights come up on each character as they sing.)

DANDELION.

SHOULD I SPEAK TO HER? YIKES! DO I DARE?

JENNIFER.

HE LOOKS NICE I MUSTN'T STARE.

PIPPA.

WILL WE BE FRIENDS THOUGH I'M REALLY SMALL?

ZIPPY.

IT'S HARD TO KNOW WHAT TO DO AT ALL.

ALL.

I'M A MIDDLE-SCHOOL KID
WITH THE REST OF THE TWEENS
WONDER IF THE OTHERS
ALSO WISH THEY WERE TEENS!
I TRY TO BE INVISIBLE IN MY OWN SKIN
'CAUSE ALL I WANNA DO IS FIT IN
ALL I WANNA DO IS FIT IN!

(ROSCOE rides in on his skateboard, holding his phone.)

ROSCOE. Hey, guys. (Snapping a picture with everyone.) Selfie! (Zooms back offstage.)

PIPPA (yelling after ROSCOE). Show off!

JENNIFER. Who was that?

DANDELION. My cousin Roscoe. But don't think all lions are like him. (*To himself.*)

IT'S TIMES LIKE THIS

ZIPPY.

HARDLY MACHO
(Pointing to his muscle.)
NOTHING TO DISCOVER

I WANNA RUN FOR COVER

PIPPA.

I'M RUFFLED FEATHERS NO MORE, NO LESS.

JENNIFER.

I'M NEW SO WHO SHOULD I TRY TO IMPRESS?

ALL.

I'M A FISH OUT OF WATER
THAT'S NO SURPRISE
NO CHANCE THAT I'LL WIN
A POPULARITY PRIZE
I'M HARDLY COMFORT'BLE IN MY OWN SKIN
'CAUSE ALL I WANNA DO IS FIT IN
ALL I WANNA DO IS FIT IN!

(TOBY runs in.)

TOBY. I'm just Jen's kid brother. No way I'm ever gonna fit in.

(TOBY runs off. The PA system is heard on the playground.)

PRINCIPAL (V.O.). Good morning animals of all stripes, colors and creeds, and welcome to Treetops Middle School. I am Principal Reginald Rhinoceros, and I am wishing you a wonderful year in your new school. When the bell rings, please report to your homeroom, and remember—at Treetops, we strive for inclusion, but celebrate our differences.

ALL. Differences?

DANDELION.

WHO WANTS TO BE DIFFERENT

ZIPPY.

AND STAND OUT FROM THE CROWD?

PIPPA.

HOW COME GROWN UPS LOVE TO SAY WE MAKE 'EM SO PROUD?

JENNIFER.

THEY SHOULD GET A GRIP ON HOW WE FEEL WITHIN

ALL.

'CAUSE ALL I WANNA DO

JENNIFER.

IS BREAK IN

ZIPPY & PIPPA.
BLEND IN

DANDELION.

FIT IN!

ALL.

ALL I WANNA DO IS FIT IN!

(Bell rings. DANDELION screws up his courage to speak to JENNIFER.)

DANDELION. I'm in homeroom thirty-two. What about you?

(Musical button. Blackout as DANDELION and JENNIFER face each other.)

Scene 2

(JENNIFER's house, three weeks later. JENNIFER is slumped on the sofa, reading a textbook. TOBY is playing a hand-held video game.)

TOBY. Prince Xanadu just crushed the silver dragon. Yes! JENNIFER (holding her ears). I'm not listening. TOBY. You've just never gotten to level five.

(JENNIFER lets go of her ears.)

JENNIFER. Can't you do something educational, like read a book?

TOBY. You don't know how to have fun. When I'm in middle school, you won't catch me doing homework on a Saturday morning.

(JENNIFER slams her book shut.)

JENNIFER. For once, the kid is right. (*Playing distractedly with a fidget toy.*) Hmm. I could watch a movie, listen to music or ... I could have a party!

TOBY. A party? Here? You're in trouble now.

JENNIFER. Mom and Dad won't mind.

TOBY. But we've only been here three weeks. Are you sure anyone will come?

JENNIFER. Well, we'll see. Won't we?

TOBY. Then can I come too?

JENNIFER. Maybe ... if you help.

(TOBY smiles, then high-fives and low-fives JENNIFER.)

- JENNIFER (cont'd). I'll text the invitations. (Handing TOBY some money.) You go to the Jungle-Mart and buy some chips, popcorn and ... cocoa-avocado-oatmeal cookies.
- TOBY. Cocoa-avocado-oatmeal cookies? Hey, you're not having a party just to invite some weirdo you like?
- JENNIFER. Toby G. Giraffe, don't stick your "neck" into places it doesn't belong. Anyway, I'm inviting my whole homeroom.

TOBY. That bunch of animals?

(TOBY runs off. JENNIFER starts texting invitations on her phone.)

(#2: "Come As You Are")

JENNIFER.

DEAR HOMEROOM THIRTY-TWO:

I'M WONDERING IF YOU

ARE SITTING AT HOME

BORED LIKE ME

WITH NOTHIN' TO DO

DROP OVER FOR A PARTY

(To herself.)

WHO DOESN'T LIKE A PARTY?

(Returning to texting.)

RIGHT ABOUT TWO

(Smiling and talking to herself.)

I'LL BE WAITING HERE FOR YOU ...

(She resumes texting.)

COME AS YOU ARE

BY BUS OR BY CAR

OR THOSE WHO CAN FLY

JUST JUMP THE WIND AND FLY BY

AND COME AS YOU ARE.

It's nothing fancy.

SO COME AS YOU ARE

'CAUSE I DON'T LIVE FAR

A PARTY TODAY

AT FORTY-FIVE ZOOLY WAY

SO COME AS YOU ARE.

TURN OFF THE TV

CUT THOSE MORNING CARTOONS

GET READY TO PARTY

WITH BEARS AND BABOONS.

DON'T CRAM FOR YOUR MATH TEST YOU'LL ACE IT, NO DOUBT

DON'T GO TO THE MALL NO, COME HERE AND HANG OUT!

YEAH!

WE'LL ROLL UP THE CARPET PLAY SOME FUNKY TUNES SO QUIT YOUR HIBERNATIN' BUST OUT OF YOUR COCOONS.

(Pushing the send button.) Send!

(ZIPPY, PIPPA and DANDELION appear with their phones. Ping sounds are heard.)

ZIPPY.

HEY, I'VE GOT A MESSAGE!

(Ping sounds.)

PIPPA.

HEY, I'VE GOT A MESSAGE!

(Ping sounds.)

JENNIFER.

HOPE THEY GOT MY MESSAGE.

ZIPPY & PIPPA.

TEXT MESSAGE FOR ME!

DANDELION (flabbergasted).

HEY, I'VE GOT A MESSAGE FROM JENNY G!

JENNIFER.

COME PLAY MY GUITAR LEAVE YOUR HOMEWORK BEHIND JENNIFER (cont'd).

JUST RELAX

EAT SOME SNACKS

DANDELION, ZIPPY & PIPPA. EAT SOME SNACKS

JENNIFER.
AND UNWIND

DANDELION, ZIPPY & PIPPA. YEAH!

JENNIFER. SKIP THE RSVP

DANDELION, ZIPPY & PIPPA. TWO P.M. AND NOT THREE

JENNIFER.
YEAH, JUST COME AS YOU ARE

DANDELION, ZIPPY & PIPPA. YEAH, WE'LL COME AS WE ARE.

ALL.

JUST COME AS YOU ARE YEAH, COME AS YOU ARE. YEAH!

(Lights fade on and scene shifts to DANDELION at home. He wears an old yellow sweater and puts down his phone.)

DANDELION. Wait a minute! Jennifer Giraffe wants *me* to come to *her* party? Just as I am? (Looking down at himself.) Ratty yellow sweater, mangy mane. Definitely no-can-do!

(#3: "At Jen's Party")

DANDELION (cont'd).

I'M A GEEK, NO, I'M A FREAK

WITH A ZIT UPON MY CHEEK

AND SHE THINKS THAT I SHOULD COME AS I AM?

I'M A NERD, NO, I'M A TURD

A GUY WHO'S NOT PREFERRED

LOOK AT ME, I'D BE BETTER OFF AS A CLAM.

At least clams have an excuse for looking ordinary ...

AT JEN'S PARTY

AT JEN'S PARTY

HOW CAN I SHOW THEM MY FACE?

HERE AM I LIKE A LUMP

LIKE A SCHLUMP

LACKING GRACE.

AT JEN'S PARTY

AT JEN'S PARTY

YOU CAN BET THEY'LL ALL AGREE

AT JEN'S PARTY

AT JEN'S PARTY

THERE'S NO CHANCE

SHE'LL LIKE ME.

She probably only invited me 'cause she had to.

I'M JUST A SIMPLE LION

SHY AND AWKWARD AND STRANGE

WHY WOULD SHE WANT TO RELY ON

DANDELION?

A GUY WHO'LL NEVER CHANGE.

Change? That's it! I'll change! I'll go out and buy some hip new clothes, I'm talkin' "really hip," and maybe even get my mane cut short or trimmed or tamed. Yeah, I'll be ... a party animal!

AT JEN'S PARTY

AT JEN'S PARTY

THEY'LL SEE ME AS A REGULAR GUY

DANDELION (cont'd).

THEY'LL HAVE TO ADMIT I'M A HIT! A SOCIAL BUTTERFLY!

AT JEN'S PARTY AT JEN'S PARTY JUST YOU WAIT AND SEE AT JEN'S PARTY I WILL BE

A BRAND NEW ME!

A BRAND NEW ME!

A BRAND NEW ME!

(DANDELION rushes off.)

Scene 3

(The playground at the middle school, later that morning. ROSCOE, wearing headphones, sails in on a skateboard. He makes a fancy stop and then bops to the music. TOBY walks by with a grocery bag.)

- ROSCOE. Hey kiddy giraffe, whatcha got there? (TOBY ignores him.) Hey, kid, I said "whatcha got there?" No one ignores "The King."
- TOBY (excited). Are you playing knights and castles or something? Can I be Prince Xanadu?
- ROSCOE. Well, Princey, since you're trespassing on my kingdom, I'm sending you straight to the dungeon.
- TOBY (getting scared). Hey, I quit. I don't wanna play that game. ROSCOE (in TOBY's face). Even with quitters, I'm still the king.

(#4: "King of the Middle School")

TOBY. Hey, leave me alone. I'm just cutting through the playground.

ROSCOE (mimicking). "I'm just cutting through the playground." (In his normal voice.) Didn't anyone tell you this is my turf. So ...

MAKE WAY FOR THE KING
YEAH, I'M DOIN' MY THING
BETTER CHECK OUT MY NEW MOVE
(Flipping the skateboard.)
I'M GROOVIN' IN THE GROOVE
'CAUSE I'M THE KING!
I'M COOL
I'M THE KING!
KING OF THE SCHOOL.

TOBY. It's Saturday. School's closed.

ROSCOE. So what! I'm still in charge.

NO ONE MESSES WITH ME
IT DON'T END HAPPILY
ON THE SWING OR THE WALL
I GO FIRST
OR NO ONE GOES AT ALL!
'CAUSE I'M THE KING!
(In TOBY'S face.)
NOBODY'S FOOL
(Poking TOBY'S chest.)
I'M THE KING!
KING OF THE SCHOOL

(TOBY starts to walk away. ROSCOE pulls him back by the shirt.)

ROSCOE (cont'd).

HEY, WATCH ME SNEAKIN' IN THE HALLWAY GOT A FAKE PASS GRAFFITI IN THE BOYS' ROOM SKIPPIN' SCIENCE CLASS

ROSCOE (cont'd).

WHO WANTS TO HAVE A FOOD FIGHT IN THE LUNCH ROOM? I'LL SHOW YOU A FOOD FIGHT SHABOOM, KABOOM!

(ROSCOE pretends to throw food, landing a good one. Then he's in TOBY's face again.)

ROSCOE (cont'd).

DON'T TANGLE WITH THE KING YOU'LL LAND UP IN A SLING A WEDGIE IN THE GYM HEY A BAD DAY.

TOBY (near tears). I don't even go to this school!

(ROSCOE continues to intimidate TOBY.)

ROSCOE.

NO ONE BETTER CROSS THE KING
IF YOU DO YOU'LL FEEL THE STING
IT'S ME WHO'LL BURST YOUR BUBBLE
JUST CALL ME "DOUBLE-TROUBLE"
'CAUSE I RULE
I'M THE KING!
YEAH, THE KING!
I'M THE KING
OF THE MIDDLE SCHOOL!
GRRRRRRR!

TOBY (nervously). Listen "king," I really gotta go.

ROSCOE. Glad you recognize who's boss around here, but you ain't goin' nowhere. Not till you tell me what's in the bag. TOBY. Nothing—nothing's in the bag.
