ACT ONE

PAGE 7

- *Add the following to Brad's speech at the bottom of the page. This portion of speech was erroneously omitted during the original printing.
- "...and they love your support. But, please, don't yell out an answer. We'll have to throw the question--and you--out. Okay?...Beautiful. You'll be a great audience. See you in a bit. (BRAD exits L.)

PAGE 9

- *Kathy: replace "soap" with "show" ("King of the Mountain," by necessity, has become a nighttime show and would not compete against a soap opera.)
- *Kathy: replace "All My Children" with "Ally McBeal" (Note: Kathy's favorite program must now be a nighttime show. If "Ally McBeal" is no longer in favor, use another nighttime show that a young, intelligent female might like to watch.)
- *Larry: replace "All My Children" with "Ally McBeal."
- *Larry: replace "\$25,000." with "A Million dollars?" (Prize money for the game show has been bumped up to be competitive with "Who Wants To Be A Millionaire?")
- *Kathy: replace "\$25,000." with "A Million dollars?"
- *Larry: replace "wins \$25,000." with "wins a million dollars. It was \$100,000--til 'Millionaire' came along."

PAGE 11

- *William: replace "'All My Children.' Which, by the way, picked up another tenth of a Nielsen." With "'Ally McBeal'--which, by the way, got its highest share ever last week." **PAGE 12**
- *Larry: replace "Vietnam" with "Afghanistan" (Sergeant much more likely to have served in a more recent conflict. "Gulf War" could also be used.)
- *Larry: replace "North Hollywood" with "Hollywood" (actually, a gay male is more likely to live in West Hollywood than North Hollywood, but most audiences wouldn't know this)

*Nedra: replace "the stakes are \$25,000" with "I can win a million dollars."

PAGE 15

*Larry: replace "\$25,000" with "a million dollars?"

*Nedra: replace "\$25,000" with "a million"

PAGE 16

*Replace Ethel/Kathy dialogue with the following (because Jim Palmer underwear ads are no longer running on TV):

Ethel: Not hardly. The only sport I like is the WWF.

Nedra: Pro wrestling is no sport--it's a joke.

Dolly: Don't tell that to The Rock, honey. He'll pile-drive you all the way

to China.

Ethel: You like The Rock, too, Dolly? Dolly: Are you kidding? The Rock rocks.

PAGE 20

*Steve: replace "working a switchboard" with "delivering pizzas." (These days, not likely that a young adult would use "working a switchboard.")

PAGE 23

*Steve: replace "Masters?" with "Master's" (Grammatical error in original printing.)

PAGE 26

*Alter portion of dialoge referring to Edgar Buchanan (because Edgar Buchanan would really be an obscure reference in the new millenium).

Kathy: No. Edgar Buchanan was a movie actor; played in a lot of

Westerns. Big beard; funny guy.

Steve: You're thinking of Gabby Hayes.

Kathy: No, I'm not. I know movies.

Steve: So do I. And I never heard of a cowboy star named Edgar Buchanan

Kathy: I didn't say he was a star.

And insert "(quickly)" before Larry's next speech beginning "Speaking of actors..." (to show Larry acting quickly to avoid any bloodshed between Kathy and Steve).

*Delete following dialogue referring to Edgar Buchanan to jibe with previous changes:

Nedra: Edgar Buchanan died April 4, 1979.

Steve: See, I told you.

Kathy: You said he was still alive.

Steve: Who aked you?

*then continue with Bill's speech beginning "Hey, Nedra, let me see your book..."

PAGE 28

*Nedra: replace "\$25,000" with "million dollars"

*Larry: replace "\$25,000" with "a million dollars"

PAGE 29

*change "movie dialogue" as follows (to be more contemporary):

Steve: In 1982, "Chariots of Fire" won the Oscar. In 1981, it was

"Ordinary People." In 1980, "Kramer vs. Kramer." Bill, you should

know 1979--it was about the army.

Bill: "Saving Private Ryan!"

Steve: No. Bill! '79--not '97! Besides "Private Ryan" didn't win Best

Picture.

Kathy: Yes, it did.

Steve: No, it didn't. "Shakespeare In Love" did. See, you don't know

everything.

Nedra: Gimme my almanac!

PAGE 30

*Nedra: replace "\$25,000" with "million"

*Ethel: replace "\$25,000" with "a million bucks"

PAGE 31

*Steve: replace "Howard Cosell's" with "William Shatner's" (Cosell has passed away.)

PAGE 33

*William: replace "served in Vietnam" with "served in Afghanistan" (or "the Gulf War.")

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*Willaim: replace "\$25,000" with "a million dollars"

PAGE 37

*Larry: replace "the \$25,000" with "money"

PAGE 39

*William: replace "\$25,000" with "lots of money" and "All My Children" with "Ally McBeal"

ACT TWO

PAGE 41

*Larry: replace "Phil Donahue." with "Alex Trebek." (Phil Donahue no longer an M.C.)

*Alter William/Brad/Larry dialogue beginning with "Phil Donohue" in the middle of the page.

William: (pausing) Jerry Springer

Brad: Springer? He's not an M.C. He's a ...ringmaster! William: Brad, why won't you just get laser surgery?

Brad: I told you, my trainer nearly went blind from laser

surgery...Besides my vision isn't bad.

PAGE 52

*Larry: replace "\$25,000" with "big bucks"

PAGE 54

*Larry: replace "over five hundred dollars worth." with "there's a trip to Hawaii with your name on it." (A fed-up Larry has become more benevolent with show's consolation prizes.)

*Dolly: insert "(brightening) Really?" in front of "I never look a gift horse in the mouth. Thanks, Larry."

PAGE 59

*Brad: replace "old television show recently made into a movie" to "classic television show" (More than "recently" since "The Twilight Zone" was made into a movie.)

PAGE 60

*Brad: replace "for you ladies of the evening, I mean, ladies of the '80's...from Mean Jeans." With "from Mean Jeans. The designer denim that fattens your asses...(frowns, then squints) I mean, flatters your assetts." ("ladies of the '80's" is now outdated.)

*Delete Larry's 3rd and 4th speeches and Bill's 4th and 5th speeches (because of change in dialogue on following page)

PAGE 63

*change Bill/Larry dialogue at starting in middle of page (to reflect a more gracious Larry and a not-so-devious Bill).

Bill: I doubt it. I wanted to win some college money for the kids--and I end up with Rice-A-Roni.

Larry: *(pause)* Actually, Bill, the consolation prizes are fantastic this week.

Bill: Nothing I could use, I'm sure.

Larry: Could you use a houseful of new furniture?

Bill: What?

Larry: Including a top-of-the-line computer with printer, scanner, copier and digital camera. The whole shebang.

Bill: You're kidding.

Larry: Dead serious. I bet that computer will help your kids get to college.

Bill: I've never been able to afford a computer. (pause, then skeptical) Consolation prizes? Larry, are you sure?

Larry: Hey, I'm the contestant coordinator. I should know.

Bill: (walks toward Larry) Larry, you're the greatest. Thanks...For everything.

Larry: You're welcome. (They hug.)

PAGE 64

*Bill: after they hug, change "(moving to exit R) That broad gets tomato--" to "(exasperated, as moves to exit R) That witch gets tomato--"

*Nedra: change "seventeen" to "thirty-six"

*Nedra: change "the names of every astronaut on all eleven Apollo Missions." to "the full names of every President--and Vice-President." (More than 11 Apollo Missions since first printing AND original text mistakenly suggests astronauts were on all of the first 11 missions.)

PAGE 69

*Larry: change "All My Children" to "Ally McBeal."

PAGE 70

*Steve: change "\$25,000" to "some serious money"

PAGE 72

*Larry: change "\$25,000...." to "a million bucks...."

*Larry: change "Tic-Tac-Dough." to "Millionaire."

*Brad: change "a man so mean he makes John McEnroe look like a nice guy" to "a man so mean he makes Dr. Evil look like a saint" and "the man who's now in charge of phony tears for 'All My Children'" to "the man who's now in charge of casting for 'Ally McBeal'"
